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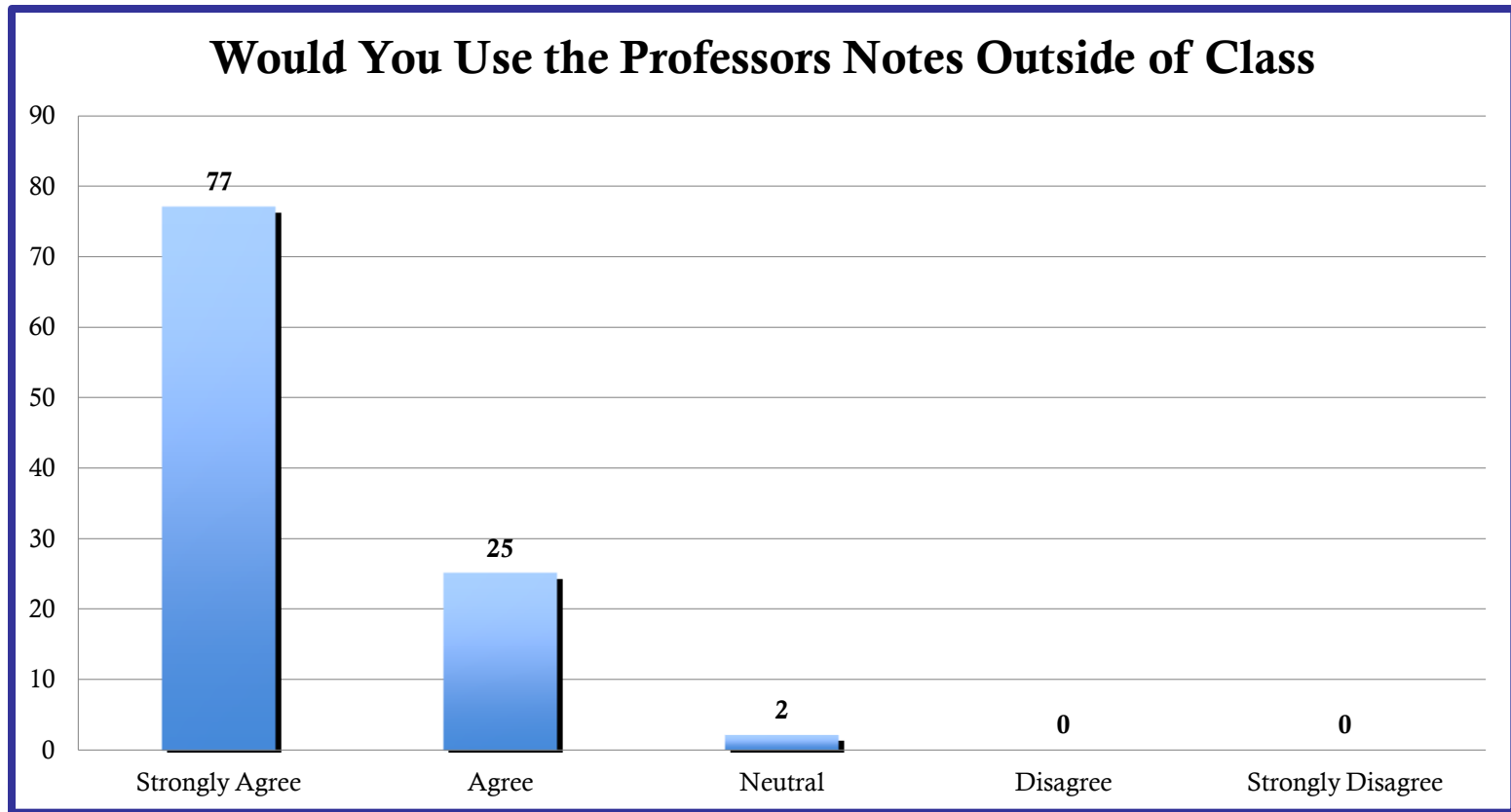

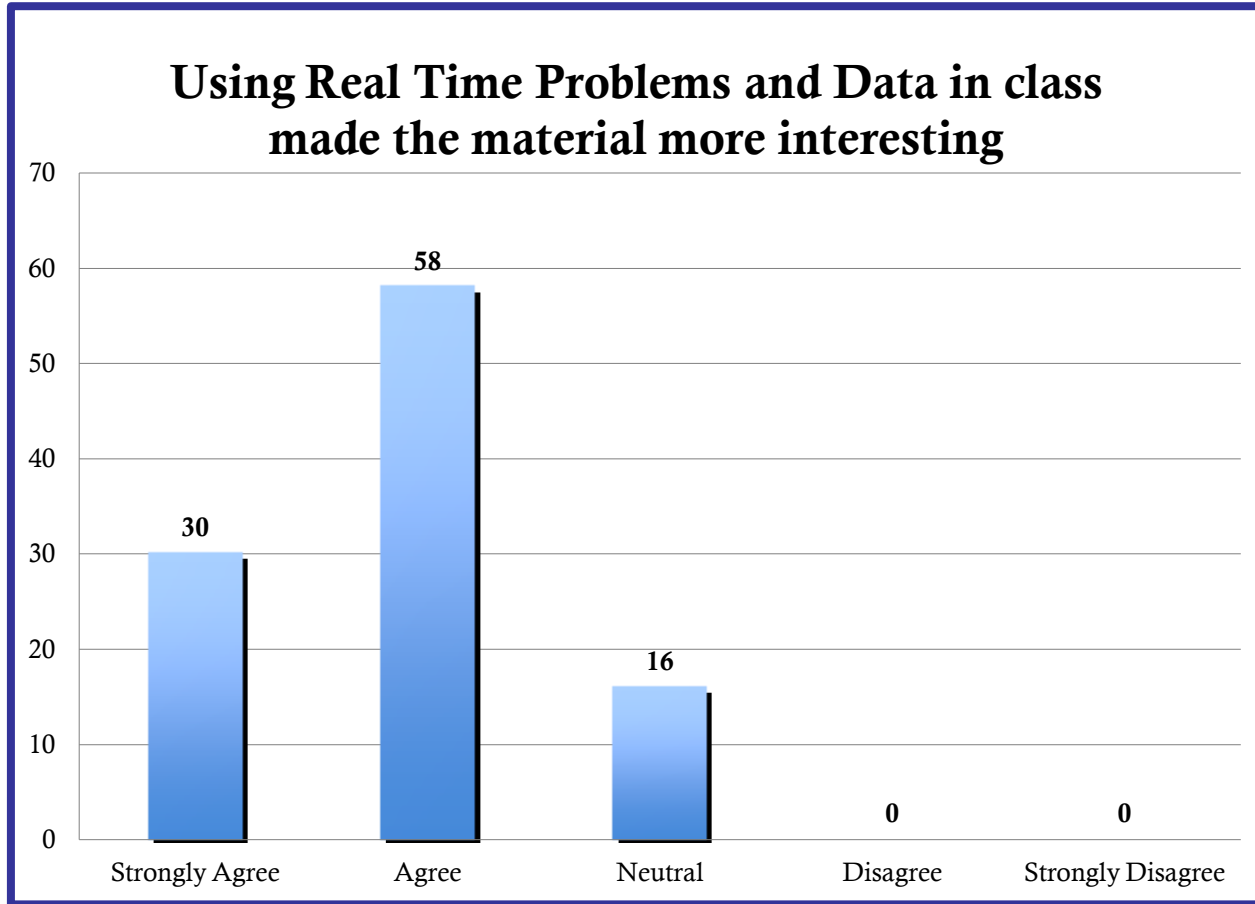
Penultimate in the Classroom

- In Fall 2012, faculty developed digital learning objects with the Penultimate App during a traditional classroom lecture.
- Students (n= 105) from multiple sections of a traditional agribusiness course were surveyed to determine the effectiveness of digital learning objects on student outcomes.

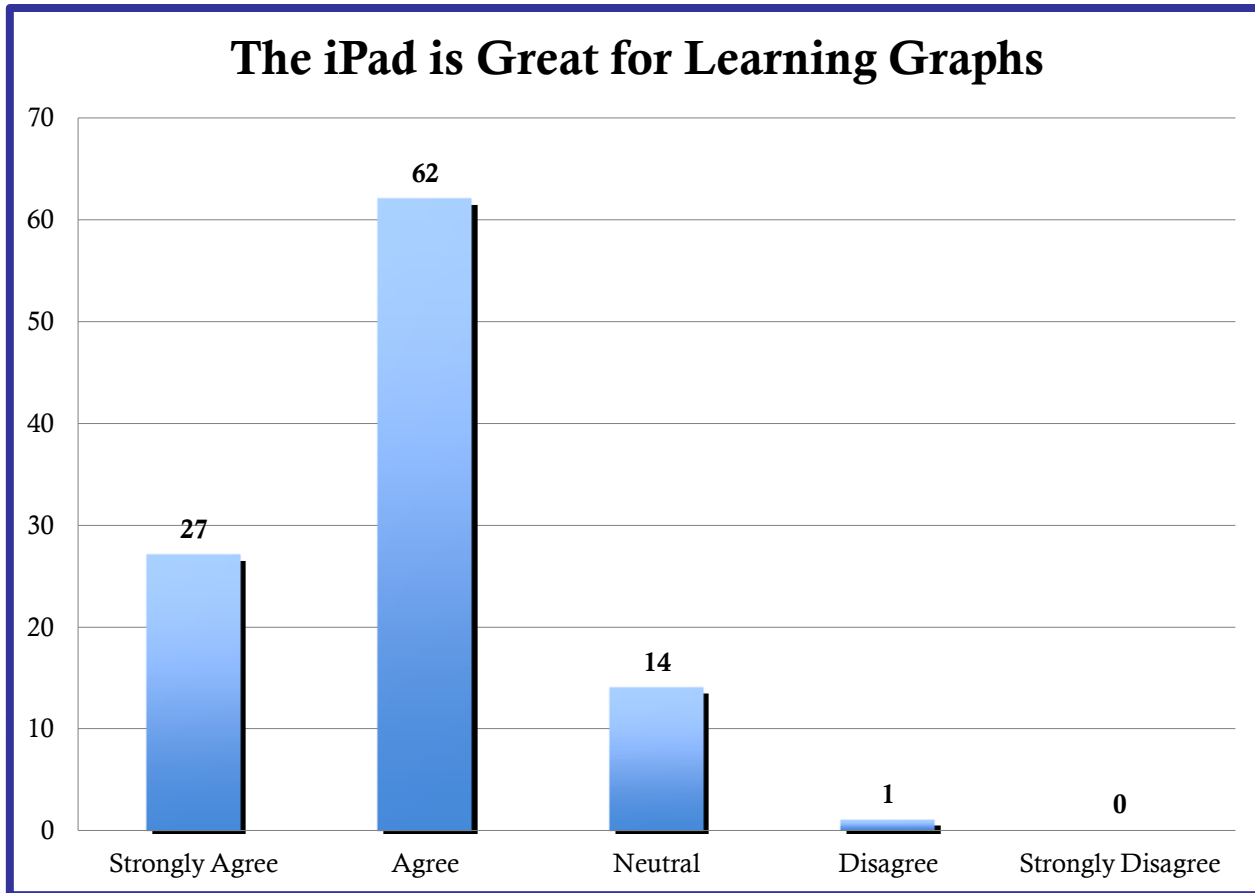

Faculty Thoughts

- Ease of Use
 - Relatively simple to learn to use the software
 - Notes are automatically saved and can be uploaded to Evernote
- *Easy to use as long as classroom technology is working (projector, computer, iPad is charged)

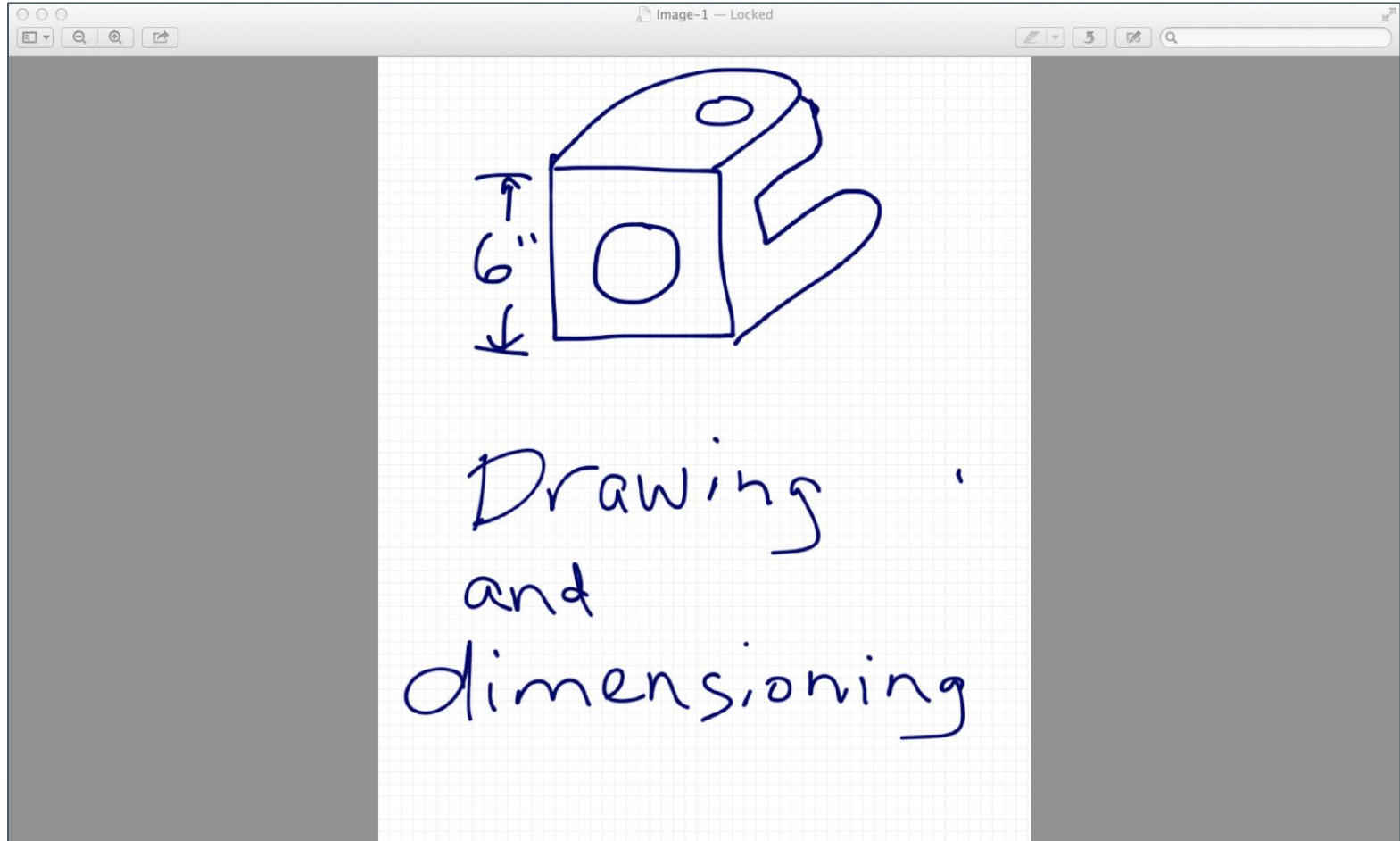
Faculty Thoughts

- Time Requirement
 - Takes a little extra time to prepare lectures and decide where to incorporate the iPad
 - Saves time when lecture is repeated because lecture prep is done
 - Very little time required to save images as a pdf and upload them to Blackboard
- Need to get premium account on Evernote if you plan to use it a lot (\$45/yr for 1GB/month)

Faculty Thoughts

- Technical Issues
 - Getting in a hurry and handwriting suffers
 - Hand hitting buttons on Penultimate
 - Writing issues if using a stylus or when screen is dirty
