Programs

 Instructors from two online programs included in study





Professional Development Conference

- Face-to-face workshop
- Instructors traveled to lowa
- Presentations focused on distance education techniques
- Mostly presentation and lecture format

Instructor Resources Webpage

- Set up by the U.S. Pork Center of Excellence
- Only available for those with an approved login and password
- o Includes:
 - Tutorials for programs commonly used
 - Help Center contacts at universities
 - Instructor supplied course materials

Webinar

- Scheduled based on availability of instructors
- Presentation conducted by Todd Vens of Iowa State University
- Instructors could interact via chat or over microphone
- Allowed time after presentation for discussion among instructors

Methods and Procedures

- Online survey through Qualtrics software
- Survey link e-mailed with four informational letters
- Fifth contact by US mail

Results

- Response rate was 55.6% (n=10)
- All resources had some value to instructors
- Majority of instructors showed interest in future conferences or webinars


Results

- Unanimous indication of above average quality of webpage
- Webpage resources rated good or excellent

Please rate the overall value of the webpage.




Results

- Two instructors used webpage resources prior to taking the survey
- Webpage resources were rated as good or excellent
- Both the face-to-face conference and the webinar were considered about equally as valuable individually
 - Ranking exercise was helpful in determining comparative value of the two


If you had the chance to attend a second webinar, would you take advantage of the...

Instructor Comments


"Webinars typically are easier to accommodate in my schedule and they allow one to ask questions, etc. They are superior to the Webpage because they have an interactive component. Webpage is second since it can be updated with new information on a regular basis and I can access it at anytime."

Instructor Comments

- "Face-to-Face is the least. It is the most time consuming and typically the least productive. I think it might be good as an introductory step..."
- "The face-to-face meeting was very helpful as it was right before my first time teaching. I think as I continue, the web resources will be just as valuable."

Conclusions

- All resources had some value to instructors
- Going forward, instructors tend to prefer web-based resources
- Webinars should be prioritized for future delivery of new information and further discussion

Conclusions Continued

- Discussion between instructors is most important feature of development tools
- Include largely new technologies or methods in future professional development
 - Experienced distance educators desire to learn new things, not repeat what they already know
