Course Description



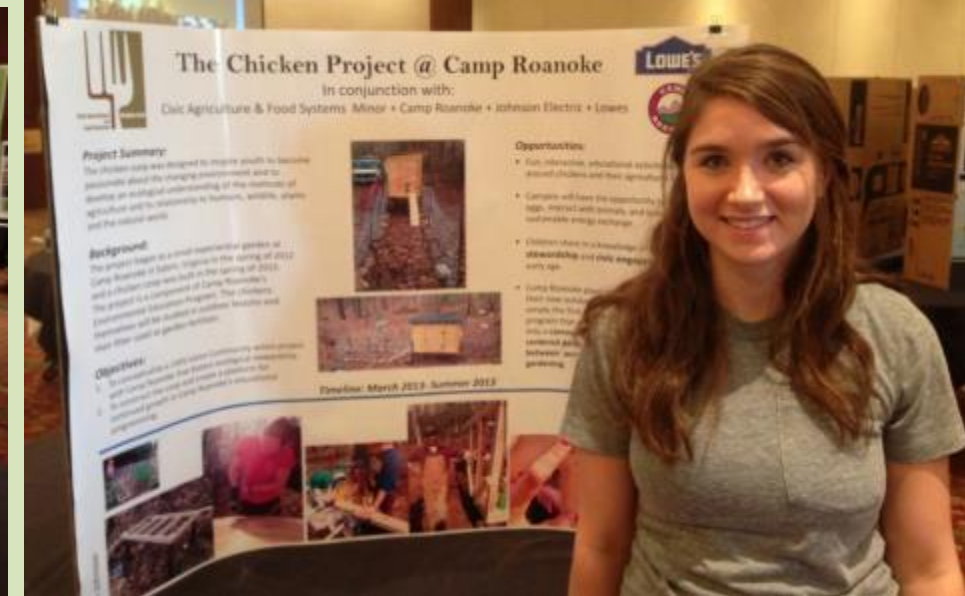
- Interdisciplinary, experiential community-based course focusing on civic agriculture-food systems.
