


Survey Objectives

Survey Methods and Procedures


- Poultry Club member survey
 - Web based survey administered by Campus Labs
 - 7 Demographical questions
 - 10 Poultry Club activity and career questions
 - Distributed via email to all Poultry Club members (~50)
 - Voluntary participation
 - 66% Response rate



Survey Methods and Procedures

- Majority in animal related degrees
 - Over 95% of members are HIYT Alumni
 - Animal Health
 - Companion and Performance Animals
 - Food Animals
 - Food Safety and Quality
 - Animal Science




Which of the following best describes your experience with poultry prior to joining the Poultry Club?

Why did you join the poultry club?




